

# Revealing the Son (Dale G. Hudson)

It has always been and always will be God's will for us to receive all that has been provided for us through the death, burial, resurrection and ascension of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Our "Canaan" or "Promised Land" or "Land of Promise" or what we call "all the promises of God" are all embedded in grace and peace, which is multiplied through the knowledge of the Father and His Son whom He has sent.

I believe with all my heart that God wants and deeply desires us to receive all that Christ died for. The entire gamut of what He gave us is in and through Jesus Christ.

Isaiah 53 shows us – By posing the question:

*"Who has believed (confidently trusted in, relied on and adhered to) our message [of salvation – **soteria**]? And to whom [if not us] has the arm and infinite power of the Lord [Jehovah] God of Covenant] been revealed"? (Isaiah 53:1 Amp)*

## Idioms

"A usual or unusual way in which the words of a particular language are joined together to express a particular thought."

Or –

A group of words in a fixed order that have a particular meaning that is different from the meanings of each word on its own.

1. When you've tried to do something that is too difficult for you – "have bitten off more than you can chew."
2. To do something that hurts yourself – "Shoot yourself in the foot."
3. To stop something or start something without any preparation is to – "Do it cold turkey."
4. The expression originally referred to a return to normal breathing after physical exhaustion but soon was extended figuratively to any effort – "I got my second wind."
5. When there is a strong hint of corruption – "there's something rotten in Denmark!"
6. When something won't fulfill its intended purpose – "that dog won't hunt." (or suggesting losing propositions for serious consideration)

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## “I will give my right arm...”

- A figurative phrase that highlights one's interests in having something or eagerness to do something
- To be willing to give something of great value for someone or something
- Since most people are “right-handed,” and considering their right arm to be more important than their left, it is to say that you want something very much.
- Being willing to pay a high price for even the essence of your livelihood or even your life

“Who has believed (confidently trusted in, relied on, and adhered to) our message [of salvation]? And to whom [if not us] has the arm and infinite power of the Lord been revealed?” (Isaiah 53:1 Amp)

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God asks, “Who has believed this message of salvation (**soteria**) of which includes:

- Forgiveness of sin (sin, iniquity, transgression)
- Healing of the body and mind
- Giving of shalom (peace):
  - Peace
  - Harmony
  - Wholeness
  - Completeness
  - Prosperity
  - Welfare
  - Tranquility
  - Hello
  - Goodbye

## PEACE

- **“Shalom”** – From the root **“saalem”** – to be safe, sound, healthy, perfect, complete (1 Kings 7:51. Neh/ 6:15) signifies a sense of well-being and harmony both within and without, completeness, wholeness, peace, health, welfare, safety, soundness, tranquility, prosperity, fullness, rest, absence of agitation or discord, a state of calm without anxiety or stress.
- It is God’s word for wholeness and goodness and total satisfaction in life. This is the abundant life Jesus promised (John 10:10). Shalom is the gift of precious, well-being; it is the establishment of a lasting, and righteous good. (Num 6:24; Eph. 2:14)

All these things are included in the **“Revealed arm of the Lord.”**

## ARM – “The Seder Table”

- **Three (3) Matzo**hs – Each wrapped in a separate linen cloth or placed in the compartments of a “matzoh unity bag” sometimes called the “Afikomen bag.”
- **Parsley** – To symbolize the coming of Spring or new life (resurrection)
- **Saltwater** – To speak of tears of the Jewish people under Egyptian bondage
- **Roasted egg** – (hard-boiled) – A memorial of the sacrificed Passover Lamb and symbolizes the sacrificial offerings that were made in the days of the Temple (Beitzah)
- **Bitter-herbs** – (horse radish) – To symbolize the bitterness of Egyptian bondage
- **Haroset** – (Mixture of chopped apples, chopped nuts, and cinnamon) – To symbolize the mortar used by the Israelites in building for Pharaoh.
- **Four cups of wine** (or grape juice) per person
- **Shank bone** – **“Zeroah”** meaning Arm (Outstretched Arm)

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**Psalm 136:** “And brought Israel out from their (Egypt) midst, for His lovingkindness is everlasting. With a strong hand and an outstretched arm, for His lovingkindness is everlasting.”

**Deut. 26:8:** “And the Lord brought us forth out of Egypt with a mighty hand, and with an outstretched arm, and with great terribleness, and with signs, and with wonders.”

**Jer. 32:17:** “Ah Lord God! Behold, You have made the heavens and the earth by Your great power and by Your outstretched arm! Nothing is too difficult for You.”

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*“...That the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of Him...” (Eph. 1:17)*

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**Glory** – “*Doxa*” – (A very apparent dignity)

- “God’s honor placed upon a people, and it so changes those people, that when the people leave His presence, individuals out in the world will have a better opinion of God because of what they see in and through those people”

The Father of “Glory” – The honor of God placed upon a “good opinion.”

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“...That you may “know” – (*Eido* – [i’- do] – Strong’s Gr. 1492) – To see with physical eyes as it naturally bridges to the metaphorical sense: perceiving (mentally seeing) this is akin to the expressions: “I see what you mean or I see what you are doing.”

A gateway to grasp spiritual truth (reality) from a physical plane. Physical seeing (sight) which should be the constant bridge to mental and spiritual seeing (comprehension).

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“That you may know what is the exceeding greatness of His power toward us who believe. These are in accordance with the working of His mighty power.” – (His outstretched arm!)  
(Ephesians 1:19)
